

THE ART OF THE POST-INTERVIEW THANK YOU NOTE

After the interview, your work isn't quite done. Writing thank you notes after a job interview is a must and is absolutely expected! Thank you notes (or emails rather) can be quite simple. Your goal is to:

- 1. Thank the person for their time
- 2. Show that you were engaged and interested in the conversation
- 3. Express your excitement about the role you interviewed for
- 4. Stay on their radar after the interview ends

Also, it's just good manners!

THANK YOU NOTE FAQS

- Q: Email or snail mail?
- A: Email to start, so the person receives it quickly. If you'd like to follow up with a handwritten note in addition, you can. Most of the time that will not be necessary
- Q: I interviewed with multiple people can I send them one note?
- A: No each interviewer should get their own personalized thank you note
- Q: What is the best way to personalize a thank you note?
- A: Share something that you enjoyed discussing during the interview show that you were actively listening and engaged in the conversation
- *Q:* When should I sent the note?
- A: Send your thank you emails the same day or day following your interview
- Q: What if I didn't get the interviewer's address?
- A: Ask the person who scheduled the interviews or make an educated guess based on the other interviewers' email addresses and the person's first and last name if it bounces back, you'll know it wasn't the correct one! Otherwise, you're all set.

A TEMPLATE

Dear [interviewer],

Thank you so much for taking the time to speak with me about the [job title] role [today/yesterday]. I really enjoyed our conversation and [hearing about/learning about/] [something that you discussed].

I am very excited about this opportunity and feel that my background in [share relevant aspects of your background] would make me a great fit for the job. [share something about why you're also excited about joining the company and/or team].
